What is Title IX?

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in federally funded education programs and activities. Title IX expands on other laws such as:

- ◆ Jeanne Ann Clery Act of 1990
- ◆ Campus Sexual Assault Victims Bill of Rights of 1992
- ◆ Violence Against Women Act of 1994
- ◆ Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act of 2013

RCC is obligated to:

- ◆ To educate students and employees regarding sexual harassment and sexual violence.
- ◆ To respond appropriately to sexual violence complaints.
- ◆ Adopt and publicize grievance procedures providing for the prompt and equitable resolution of student and employee sex discrimination complaints.
- ◆ To provide adequate, reliable, and impartial investigations of complaints.
- ◆ Take the appropriate steps to prevent recurrence of any sexual violence/harassment complaint.
