Attendees will be educated on the 1st Amendment and the Constitutional protections it affords to all groups discussed. Further, attendees will be trained to identify violent extremism and discern between criminal activity and First Amendment protected speech and actions, recognize and understand the numerous criminal subcultures and extremist groups living and operating in their jurisdiction, understand and predict the dynamics of encounters with the various criminal subcultures presented, complete safe, competent and thorough investigations involving various criminal subversive groups and define, explain, and train fellow officers on the tactics of various criminal subcultures and domestic extremist groups present in their jurisdictions.

Rob Finch is a NC Detective with over 10 years experience working in a large criminal intelligence unit. Responsibilities include monitoring, documenting and prosecuting subversive criminal organizations and domestic terrorism subjects that include sovereign citizens/antigovernment extremists, outlaw motorcycle gangs, anarchists, white supremacists, black identity extremists and animal/earth extremists. Finch has worked numerous criminal cases on the state and federal levels that have resulted in successful prosecutions of these groups.
