Part II Participation in Program Information Session

Applicants <u>must submit a signed certificate</u> of participation in a Surgical Technology Information Session with the application. The program director, program faculty or designee will provide a signature that denotes the applicant's attendance in a program information session.

• Signed Information Session Certificate – A maximum 2 points (only one certificate will be considered).

Part III References

Each applicant must submit three references on forms provided by the Admissions Office. **The only references that will be awarded points are high school teachers, college faculty and employers.** A maximum of 1 point will be awarded for each reference (total of 3 points). Completed rating forms should be submitted (in sealed envelopes) with all other admissions materials.

Part IV Provisional Acceptance

- 1. A point selection process will be used to rank applicants for provisional acceptance into the program. Only applicants who have completed all the admissions requirements/criteria will be ranked for review. Particular consideration will be given to those applicants who have successfully completed the general/related education courses for the program or appropriate high school courses.
- 2. Applicants <u>must have a 2.8 or greater grade point average (GPA)</u> in program general education/related courses at the time of the application submission to Admissions in order to be considered for health science program admission.
- 3. Robeson Community College health science faculty will review the achievement potential of each applicant. During the candidate review process, faculty will examine previous academic records and pre-entrance examination scores to determine congruence with curriculum academic demands and program expectations.
- 4. Top applicants will be required to attend a final information session hosted by Surgical Technology faculty in July. Notification of this session will be sent by mail. This session is designed to provide applicants with additional program requirements. Applicants who are chosen for the program are offered provisional acceptance based on fulfillment of all admission requirements/criteria by the deadline specified in the provisional acceptance letter.
