### Part IV References

Each applicant must submit <u>three professional references</u>. Preference is given to references from academic, employment and/or professional affiliates. <u>Only professional references will be awarded points</u>. A maximum of two (2) points will be awarded for each reference for a total of six (6) points. Completed reference forms should be submitted (in sealed envelopes) with other admissions materials.

### Part V Provisional Acceptance

- 1) A <u>Point System</u> will be used to rank applicants for provisional acceptance. Only applicants who have completed all the admissions requirements/criteria will be ranked for review. Particular consideration will be given to those applicants who have successfully completed the general /related education.
- 2) Applicants <u>must have a 3.0 or greater grade point average (GPA)</u> in program general education/related courses at the time of the application submission to Admissions in order to be considered for health science program admission.
- 3) Applicants provisionally accepted will be <u>required to submit a letter of intent and attend</u> a mandatory Meetn-Greet to secure their provisional acceptance.
  - Applicants not accepted for program will be advised regarding alternate majors and/or general education coursework.

### **Provisional Requirements**

Prior to receiving full acceptance and/or enrolling in the Nursing program, applicants provisionally accepted <u>MUST</u> complete and/or provide documentation of the following:
