Civil Liability for SRT / SWAT

The purpose of this course is to advise law enforcement officers of common SRT civil liability areas, and of ways to avoid civil liability and how to defend against civil actions. At the end of this course, students will be familiar with Fourth Amendment doctrine, with specific reference to "reasonableness" in entering homes and in use of force. Students will be familiar with the legal standards involved in the use of force and deadly force. Students will become aware of the importance of legal procedures, personnel selection, operations, and tactics. Those attending the course will become familiar with potential supervisory liability. Students will be aware of how a lawsuit proceeds and the importance of the defense of qualified immunity
