




<u>Title:</u> Eyes That Kiss in the Corners


<u>Title:</u> Indian Americans: Unity and


A brief historical study of Indian-white relationships in the Americas introduces an analysis of contemporary culture and problems in tribes of the United States.

Includes well-crafted, culturally authentic folktales contributed by storytellers of varying cultures and ethnicities




<u>Title:</u> Voices for Diversity and Social Justice : A Literary Education


This book captures the struggle for identity, the fight for recognition, the disillusion with school and the desire to be seen, to be included and to be counted.


