Research Hack

Tips and tricks from the pros



To cite or not to cite? That is the question...

Knowing when to use a citation in your research can sometimes be tricky. Think of citations as trail markers, guiding your readers through your research, connecting ideas, and marking a clear path to the conclusion.

Here are some basic guidelines for knowing when to include a citation:

- When using a direct quote
- When referencing something that is not common knowledge (*know your audience!*)
- When paraphrasing or summarizing
- When referencing or using media (images, video, audio, etc.)

Interested in learning more about welding and metal working? We've got you covered! Check out this selection from our New Books display located on the first floor of the library.

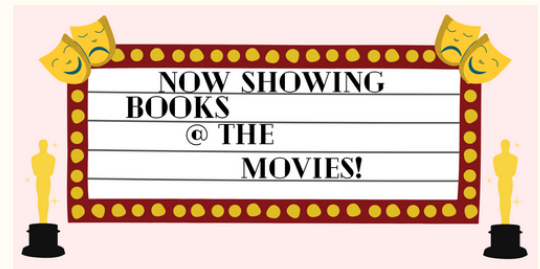


The First Gulf War Exhibit

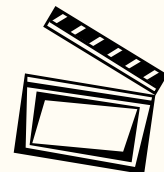
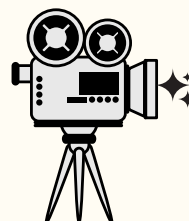
