

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

- 1. Create an FSA ID username & password
  - a. For Dependent students, your parent must create their own FSA ID.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.studentaid.gov
- 3. Add RCC school code: 008612
- 4. Submit the completed FAFSA allow **3-5 days** for processing by ED.
- Check RCC Self Service & email and submit requested documents to the Financial Aid Office. Allow 1-2 weeks for processing.
- 6. Submit high school transcripts or equivalent to the Admissions Office.
- Enroll in a financial aid approved program of study.
- Register <u>only</u> for courses included in your program of study.
- View award eligibility via your student Self Service portal.

# **SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES**

Students with **documented** unusual and/or special circumstances such as loss of employment, divorce, parental abandonment, homelessness may qualify for adjustments to their FAFSA elements via a **professional judgment**. # **ENROLLMENT STATUS**

Awards are based on <u>full-time</u> status; however, aid will be pro-rated to reflect the student's enrollment status. <u>For example</u>, a student enrolled in 9 credit hours will receive an adjustment equal to 75% of their award (\$2,000 \* .75 = \$1,500)

Status	Credit
Full-Time	12 (or more) credit hours 15+crs for NC Community College Grant
3/4 Time	9-11 credit hours
1/2 Time*	6-8 credit hours
Less Than Half Time (LTHT)*	1-5 credit hours

<sup>\*</sup>Students enrolled for less than 6 credits are not eligible to receive certain State and Federal grants

### REFUNDS TO STUDENTS

Checks are mailed to the student's address on file

#### Before disbursement checks are generated:

- 1. Attendance must be verified in every class
- 2. All charges (*tuition*, *fees*, *books and supplies*, *etc.*) made to the college are deducted prior to refund.

# **ATTENDANCE**

Student must begin attendance in <u>ALL</u> courses. <u>Never attends</u> or <u>No Shows</u> are not covered. Awards are adjusted to reflect actual enrollment status as of the student's "Financial Aid Freeze Date". This is the date we take a "snapshot" of your enrollment status to establish the "official enrollment status" for reporting purposes and financial aid eligibility. Your enrollment status on this day is what will be used to calculate your disbursement.

### **FUNDING LIMITS**

- Federal Pell Grant up to six years or 12 semesters of full-time enrollment or upon completion of a bachelor's degree.
- North Carolina Scholarship- up to ten full-time academic semesters
- Developmental Courses up to 30 credit hours

#### **HOW TO KEEP YOUR AID**

After each semester, students must meet the following:

- 1. Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- 2. Complete 67% of all attempted courses
- 3. Complete the requirements of your program of study within a time frame not to exceed 150% of the published length. For example, if an academic program length is 60 credit hours, the maximum credit hours that are eligible for financial aid is 90 (60 \* 150% = 90)

Students failing these requirements have the right to appeal their status with supporting documentation.

### **RETURNING FUNDS**

**STAY IN CLASS!** Students receiving financial aid funds who cease enrollment (officially or unofficially) may have to repay a portion of the aid already received. Students who remain in courses passed the following time of the term will have earned their federal funds.

• Federal Aid: 60% of the term

• State Aid: 35% of the term

# **HELPFUL TIPS**

- FAFSAs must be renewed annually (October 1st).
- Complete and submit all requested documents by the PRIORITY DEADLINE of July 1st.
- You may repeat a previously passed course (grade of "D" or better) one additional time for a better grade.
- Incomplete "I" grades are treated as a "F" grade.
- Be prepared to present your Student ID/government issued ID when inquiring about your financial aid.
- Stay informed! Visit our website, log into your student Self-Service portal, check your email, and follow us on social media.
- Stay in class! Attend all classes and consult with us if you need to withdraw or stop attending classes.
- Contact your assigned Financial Aid Specialist for any questions. We can't help if we don't KNOW your circumstances.
