Note:

Applicants completing the Health Science Admissions process after the established timeline will be considered based on space availability.

Students are expected to attend a Radiography Program Information Session. Applicants will earn 2 points for the application packet by submitting a signed certificate of participation.

NOTE: Students must have a 3.0 or greater grade point average (GPA) in program general education/related courses at the time of checklist submission in order to be considered for health science program admission.

- For **Radiography**, the GPA will be based upon grades earned in BIO 168, BIO 169, ENG 111, ENG 112 or COM 231, MAT 143, MED 120, a Social/Behavioral Science elective, and the Humanities/Fine Arts elective.
- The Radiography Program Faculty will not receive student packets for review if the GPA is less than 3.0 in Radiography general education/related courses.
- Students may earn points for admission based upon final course grades in HSC 110; however, this course is **not** considered in the calculation of GPA for admission.

Part III References

Each applicant must submit three references on forms provided on the program's webpage. **The only references that will be awarded points are high school health occupations teachers (for recent high school graduates who took health occupations courses), college faculty (who you have taken a class under), and employers (only one reference can be from your employer).** A maximum of 1 point will be awarded for each reference (total of 3 points). Completed rating forms should be submitted (in sealed envelopes) with all other admissions materials.

Part IV Provisional Acceptance

A point selection process will be used to rank applicants for provisional acceptance into the program. Only applicants who have completed all the admissions requirements/criteria will be ranked for review. Particular consideration will be given to those applicants who have successfully completed the general/related education courses for the program or appropriate high school courses. Completed application packets will be reviewed by the health science program director for consideration.

NOTE: Students must have a 3.0 or greater grade point average (GPA) in program general education/related courses at the time of checklist submission to Admissions in order to be considered for health science program admission. The Radiography faculty will not review if the GPA is less than 3.0 in Radiography general education/related courses and pre-health courses.

Robeson Community College health science faculty will review the achievement potential of each applicant. During the candidate review process, faculty will examine previous academic records and pre-entrance examination scores to determine congruence with curriculum academic demands and program expectations.

Provisional Acceptance

Applicants who are chosen for the program are offered provisional acceptance based on fulfillment of all admission requirements/criteria by the deadline specified in the provisional acceptance letter.

Prior to receiving full acceptance and/or enrolling in the first radiography course, all applicants provisionally accepted **MUST** complete and/or provide documentation of the following list. These requirements are not to be completed until the student has been provisionally accepted.

1. Medical Review/Screen, which includes but not limited to:
 - a. (2) Separate PPDs: Proof of Negative Tuberculin (Tb) skin testing, negative QuantiFERON-TB blood test, or follow-up chest X-ray within 3 months of enrollment. *Students should not receive the first PPD until they have been notified of provisional acceptance.*
 - b. Immunizations:
 - Tdap, tetanus vaccines, Hepatitis B series, MMR, Rubella, Varicella series or positive titer (required)
 - Current Flu Vaccine (required for shadowing during provisional acceptance; in addition, students who gain final acceptance are required to get the flu shot annually in September/ October.)
2. Criminal Background Check, Drug Screen and National Sex Offender Index: Clinical agencies require a criminal background check (including, but not limited to, the National Sex Offender Index and Nationwide Healthcare Fraud and Abuse Scan) and 12 panel urine drug screen prior to clinical experiences or rotations. This testing is scheduled by the College once students have been provisionally accepted.
3. The student must provide documentation of healthcare insurance.

NOTE: (1) If results of a criminal background check, panel urine drug screen or sex offender index prevents a student from participating in a clinical rotation at any agency, then the student will not be able to fulfill the clinical requirements for the program, and subsequently will not be allowed to complete the Radiography program. (2) Fees associated

with the criminal background check and drug screen will be the responsibility of the student.

4. Healthcare-Providers CPR: Prospective students must submit documentation of current CPR certification (including infant, child and adult certification) from the American Heart Association BLS Healthcare Providers Course.
5. Successfully complete 2 job shadowing experiences (To be scheduled by Radiography faculty once students have been provisionally accepted.)
6. Successfully complete skeletal diagrams and anatomy and physiology assessments. Points earned from these assessments will determine which students are invited to the Radiography Prep Course outlined in Item #7. Upon receiving provisional acceptance, applicants will be provided with study guides for these assessments.
7. Participate in a 4-day *Radiography Prep Course* in June/July 2025. Students **provisionally accepted** into the program will be notified by the Radiography Program Director of the specific dates and times of the course. Attendance for the entire face-to-face course is required for consideration for final acceptance into the program. This course will serve to introduce potential students to the terminology and equipment related to Radiography. Students will be awarded points towards admission based on their performance on written assessments and skills checkoffs completed during the course.
8. Attend at a **Mandatory Radiography Orientation** (To be Scheduled- usually in late July or early August)
9. **Program Prerequisites**: Applicants admitted to the program must submit, prior to enrollment into the program, documentation of successfully completing the following courses with a “C” or higher:
 - BIO 168 Human Anatomy & Physiology I
 - BIO 169 Human Anatomy & Physiology II
 - MED 120 Survey of Medical Terminology
10. Provisionally accepted students previously enrolled in any other radiography programs must submit a letter from the program director. **Failure to submit this letter will result in cancellation of the student’s application.**

Health Science Alternatives

If I am **not** accepted in my program of choice, I request that my application packet be forwarded to the program(s) marked below. If more than one program is selected, please rank them beginning with “1” being the first choice, “2” second choice. Please pick a maximum of 2 programs only. **Consider alternative program requirements to ensure you are choosing programs for which you qualify (Example: If you are completing your application for the Radiography Program, and indicating Medical Sonography as your first alternative program, you must have credit for PHY 110 and 110A to meet their application requirements.)**

Please do **not** check the program for which you are initially submitting an application packet.

- _____ Associate Degree Nursing
Requirements: Minimum 3.0 GPA in program Prerequisites and Corequisites, Minimum 50 TEAS score, Prerequisites: BIO 168, BIO 169, CHM 131 & 131A or CHM 151, PSY 150, Completion of a Nurse Aide program and current North Carolina Certification.
- _____ Medical Sonography
Requirements: Minimum 3.0 GPA in program Prerequisites and Corequisites, BIO 163 or BIO 168 & BIO 169, PHY 110 & PHY 110A, MAT 143.
- _____ Practical Nursing
Requirements: Minimum 3.0 GPA in program Prerequisites and Corequisites, Minimum 50 TEAS score, Prerequisites: BIO 168, Completion of a Nurse Aide program and current North Carolina Certification. Program begins Spring semester (January) each year.
- _____ Respiratory Therapy
Requirements: Minimum 2.5 GPA in program Prerequisites and Corequisites. Prerequisites: BIO 168, BIO 169, CHM 131 & 131A or CHM 151, MAT 110.
- _____ Surgical Technology
Requirements: Minimum 2.8 GPA in program Prerequisites and Corequisites. Prerequisites: BIO 168, BIO 169.
