REGISTRATION INFORMATION

\$35 for NC Emergency Services Personnel – all classes

Out of state/non-affiliated students must pay an additional fee. See below:

\$70 for classes 24 hours or less.

\$125 for classes over 24 hours.

When completing the registration form, use the class number to indicate your choice of classes. You can pick up to four choices. We will not accept registration forms by email or fax. Walk-in registrations are accepted with proper payment.

Class Check-in: Room assignments will be posted at the registration desk in building 13, the student center. All classes, with the exception of a few, will be held on main campus. You must be present the first day of class in order to register.

Certificates: The college does not issue attendance certificates. Certification class grades will be submitted to NC OSFM and should show on your transcript within 30 days of course completion. Students who fail a course will be notified by letter.

Emergencies: During class hours, dial (910) 272-3338.

Refunds will not be given for **any** reason with the exception if your requested class(es) do not make. If you cannot attend, another student may attend in your place provided you call ahead and notify us of the change at (910) 272-3330.

NOTICE TO STUDENTS

Effective July 1, 2019, all students participating in live fire training are required to be eighteen years of age and have met the minimum requirements for NFPA 1403. The Chief or training officer of the department will be required to sign off on students who have met the minimum requirements before they can participate. A copy of the required form is located on the back of the registration form.

All students attending classes for certification through the NC Office of State Fire Marshal are required to have proper identification with them, as verification is required before being administered a certification test. 1. No Room for Hesitation: Vehicle Extrication Fundamentals (12 hours)

Friday 6:30pm-10:30pm, Saturday 8am-5pm

This introductory course provides students with the fundamental knowledge and hands-on skills required for basic vehicle extrication operations. Participants will learn scene size-up, hazard recognition, vehicle stabilization, patient access, and safe use of common extrication tools. Emphasis is placed on teamwork, communication, and responder safety while performing efficient and effective rescue operations. Ideal for new firefighters and rescue personnel, this course builds a solid foundation for real-world extrication incidents.

2. Fire Investigation for the First Responder (12 hours)

Friday 6pm-10pm, Saturday 8am-5pm,

This course introduces first responders to the basic principles of fire investigation. Students will learn how to recognize and preserve potential fire cause evidence, document the scene, and understand fire behavior indicators. Emphasis is placed on proper scene security, safety, and coordination with investigators to ensure critical information is protected. Ideal for firefighters and first-arriving personnel, this course enhances awareness and supports effective fire investigation efforts.

3. Into the Inferno: No-Nonsense Live Fire Training (22 hours) \$45.00 Registration FEE

Friday 6pm-10pm, Saturday 8am-7pm & Sunday 8am-5pm

This advanced, hands-on live fire course immerses students in realistic fireground scenarios designed to build confidence, coordination, and tactical decision-making. Participants will engage in multiple live fire evolutions, including a simulated rail car fire, LP gas fire control, and Class A fire attacks within a two-story burn building. Emphasis is placed on fire behavior, hose line deployment, crew integrity, and safe, effective suppression techniques. This course is ideal for firefighters looking to enhance their live fire experience in a controlled, high-intensity training environment. **NEEDS Full firefighter PPE with SCBA**

4. School Bus Extrication (16 hours)

Friday 7pm-10pm., Saturday 8am – 500pm & Sunday 800am-1pm

This course provides hands-on training in patient extrication from school bus incidents. Students will learn scene size-up, hazard recognition, patient access, and removal techniques unique to large passenger vehicles. Emphasis is placed on safety, stabilization, and teamwork while operating in complex, high-occupancy rescue scenarios. Ideal for firefighters and rescue personnel seeking practical extrication experience.

5. Big Fire Big Water (12 hours)

Friday 6:30pto 10:30p Saturday 8a to 5p

This course focuses on managing large-scale water supply operations for high-volume fire incidents. Students will learn techniques for establishing and maintaining sustained water flow, including relay pumping, tanker operations, and drafting. Emphasis is placed on coordination, apparatus placement, and efficient water movement to support big fire attack operations. Ideal for firefighters looking to strengthen their water supply skills on large incidents.

6. Advanced Fire Behavior (12 hours)

Friday 6:30pm-10:30pm, Saturday 8am-5pm

This course provides an in-depth look at fire dynamics through hands-on training using the Max Fire Box (Phase 1 and Phase 2). Students will observe and analyze fire growth, smoke conditions, flashover indicators, and ventilation effects in a controlled environment. Emphasis is placed on reading fire conditions, predicting fire behavior, and making safe, informed tactical decisions on the fireground. Ideal for firefighters seeking to enhance situational awareness and fire behavior knowledge.

7. First Line in: Hose Tactics for the Fireground (12 hours)

Friday 630pm-10:30pm, Saturday 8am-5pm

This is an entry-level course designed to build the fundamental skills needed for effective fireground hose operations. Students will learn proper hose deployment, stretching techniques, nozzle control, water flow management, and coordinated team movement. Emphasis is placed on safety, communication, and efficient line advancement under realistic conditions. This hands-on class prepares firefighters to confidently place and operate hoselines in support of fire attack and suppression activities

Needs: Full Firefighter PPE

8. Irons in Action: Forcible Entry That Works_(12 hours)

Friday 6:30p to 10:30p Saturday 8a to 5p

This course covers the fundamentals and best practices of forcible entry operations using the Blue Door training prop. Students will learn proper tool selection, techniques, and common mistakes to avoid when forcing doors, windows, and other entry points. Emphasis is placed on efficiency, safety, and minimizing property damage while gaining rapid access. Ideal for firefighters looking to improve their forcible entry skills and decision-

making on the fireground through realistic, hands-on training

9 MAYDAY SAFETY and SURVIVAL (24 hours)

Friday 1pm to 10pm Saturday 8am to 6pm Sunday 8am to 4pm

This course teaches essential skills for firefighter survival and mayday response in emergency situations. Students will learn how to recognize distress, call and manage a mayday, perform self-rescue, and assist trapped or downed firefighters. Emphasis is placed on situational awareness, rapid decision-making, and teamwork to enhance safety on the fireground. Ideal for all firefighters seeking to improve survival skills under high-risk conditions.

NEEDS FULL FIREIFGHTER PPE including SCBA and Spare Bottle

10. Driver Operator Intro / Basic Pumps (40 hours)

Wednesday 1pm-10pm, Thursday 8am-6pm, Friday 8a-6pm, Saturday 8am-6pm & Sunday 8am-1pm

This course introduces firefighters to the basic principles and operation of fire apparatus pumps. Students will learn pump components, water flow, pressure control, and establishing a reliable water supply. Emphasis is placed on safe pump operations, troubleshooting, and supporting fireground operations. Ideal for firefighters preparing for driver/operator responsibilities. 11. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OPERATIONS (40 hours)

Wednesday 1pm-10pm, Thursday 8am-6pm, Friday 8a-6pm, Saturday 8am-6pm & Sunday 8am-1pm

This course meets OSFM's training requirements for the Hazardous Materials Operations credential. Course content includes lecture and practice activities needed to perform the following tasks safely and effectively: (1) implement standard operating procedures in the current edition of the DOT Emergency Response Guidebook; (2) analyze hazardous materials/WMD incident; (3) plan an initial response to a hazardous materials/WMD incident; (4) implement the planned response for a hazardous materials/WMD incident; (5) evaluate the progress of the actions taken at a hazardous materials/WMD incident.

Needs: Full PPE

12. Chief 101 (8 hours)

Saturday 8:30 – 5:30am

This class will satisfy the 9S inspection criteria as specified by the North Carolina Administrative Code. The primary objective of the course is to inform current and future chief officers of the various aspects and complexities surrounding the operations and organization of North Carolina fire departments. Emphasis will be placed on ratings and inspections, NERIS reporting, prevention and grant programs, basic line-of-duty death information, financial considerations, and an overview of the various expectations facing a chief officer

13. Rescue Diver (16 hours)

Friday 6:30pm to 10:30pm Saturday 8a to 5p Sunday 8a to 1p

This course introduces the fundamentals of public safety diving and water rescue operations. Students will learn basic dive safety, search techniques, victim recovery, and teamwork in underwater environments. Emphasis is placed on safety, communication, and effective coordination during rescue scenarios. Ideal for firefighters and rescue personnel seeking an introduction to dive operations.

14. Everyone Goes Home (12 hours)

Friday 6:30pm to 10:30pm Saturday 8a to 5p

This course emphasizes the critical importance of firefighter safety and survival through the *Everyone Goes Home*® initiative. Students will explore the 16 Firefighter Life Safety Initiatives, focusing on risk management, accountability, situational awareness, and decision-making on the fireground. The class reinforces a culture where safety is the top priority, ensuring that every firefighter has the knowledge and mindset to prevent line-of-duty injuries and deaths—and make it home after every call.

15. Chaos to Control: Tactical Command for First responders (12 hours)

Friday 6:30pm to 10:30pm Saturday 8a to 5p

This course provides fire officers and firefighters with the essential knowledge and skills needed to effectively command and control emergency incidents. Participants will learn the fundamentals of incident command, scene size-up, resource management, communication, and decision-making under pressure. Emphasis is placed on maintaining accountability, ensuring firefighter safety, and coordinating operations to achieve successful incident outcomes.

16 Emergency Vehicle Driver (24 hours)

Friday 1pm to 10pm Saturday 8am to 6pm Sunday 8am to 4pm

This course provides emergency responders with the fundamentals of safe and effective emergency vehicle operation in accordance with North Carolina standards. Students will learn defensive driving techniques, legal requirements, and strategies for reducing risk during emergency and non-emergency responses. Emphasis is placed on safety, decision-making, and responsible vehicle operation.

17 Down and Dirty RIT (20 hours)

Friday 6:30pm to 10:30pm Saturday 8am to 5pm Sunday 8am to 5pm This course is built on facts—not feelings. Using real-world data and line-of-duty reports, it breaks down what happens during a Mayday and what it takes to rescue a downed firefighter. Students train in realistic, high-stress scenarios that replicate the chaos of the fireground. This is aggressive, time-sensitive training focused on RIT deployment, air management, rapid decision-making, firefighter removal, and disciplined communication when seconds matter.

18 PTSD Awareness for the First Responder (8 hours)

Saturday 8am to 5pm

This course provides first responders with a foundational understanding of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and its impact on mental health and job performance. Participants will learn to recognize common signs and symptoms, understand risk factors, and explore healthy coping strategies. The course also emphasizes peer support, early intervention, and available resources to promote resilience and overall well-being in the emergency services profession.
